
On behalf of the City of Chicago, I am honored to welcome all those gathered for the Fernando Jones' 13th Annual Summer Blues Camp for Youth.

Global Impact

Fernando Jones' Blues Camp International has been presented in performing arts centers and on college campuses in America, Asia and Europe at no economic impact to the families of the Blues Kids. Each participant receives a tuition waiver scholarship. The technology and resources invested in each of them has a value range of \$1,500 to \$2,500. All instruments are welcome. This priceless, fun-filled opportunity is designed to impact the life of the Blues Kid who simply wants to experience this cultural enrichment and intercultural awareness opportunity in an organic, nurturing environment with like-minded others.

Blues Kids Foundation uses the Kennedy Center ArtsEdge Standards and the standards regulating musical diversity from United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO).

Goals

- Keep the Blues youthful and exciting, while preserving it and building on the past.
- Introduce this American art form to new youth audiences, globally.
- Use critical thinking skills, while collaborating with others.
- Apply practical skills learned in class in a culminating activity on stage.

Learning Outcomes

- Improve music literacy by learning and playing songs by ear and reading tabs + chord charts.
- Improve participation by engaging students with instruments of interest.
- Communicate using cross-generational/regional “musician” language.
- Use proper dynamics to ensure appropriate volume levels for vocalists and songs.
- Critique and self-evaluate performances and provide feedback to others.
- Perform as “one” in an ensemble setting.

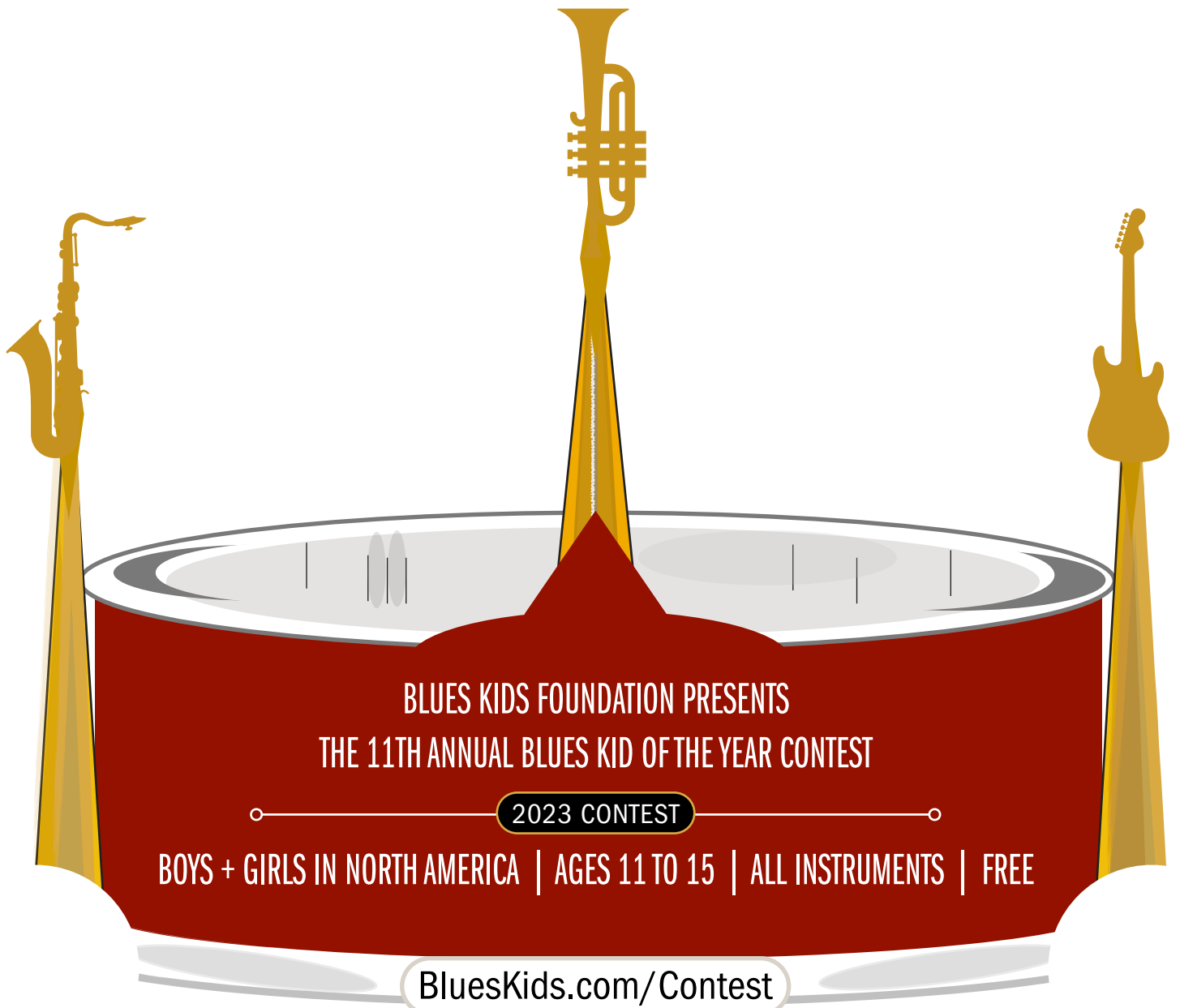
